Environment & Parks



Our neighbourhoods were particularly hard hit by the LDD (Gypsy) Moth infestation last year. Thank you to everyone who helped combat this issue by identifying heavy infestation locations in our area. Based on feedback from our community, the City is planning an Aerial Spray Management Program from May 16 to June 15, which will be applied to certain areas of our ward.

Taking Action on Leaf Blowers

Thank you to the hundreds of residents who have signed my petition at shelleycarroll.ca/leaf-blowers to support a seasonal or year-round ban on gas-powered leaf blowers. Staff will report back on the noise impact of these machines later this year. Additionally, I have requested that staff present a plan to phase out gaspowered leaf blowers for municipal use. We're already seeing this policy move forward in cities like Markham and Ottawa. As the fourth largest city in North America, the City of Toronto should be a leader on this issue and phase out these harmful machines.



I had the pleasure of touring the newly rehabilitated Duncan Creek this past fall. I was thrilled to see major improvements that made the trail safer and more resilient for our community. I am happy to share that in addition to Urban Forestry's planting plan, there are two community tree plantings taking place this spring to help reforest the ravine. I know our community will help make the ravine a vibrant and beloved green space in Don Valley North.

East Don Ravine Construction

Work is ongoing to upgrade the sewer system in the East **Don Ravine** at northwest corner of Sheppard Avenue East and Leslie Street. We are currently in Phase I of the construction project, which includes removal of the concrete weir, channel improvements, and continued work on sewer replacement/connections. Work hours have been updated to include Saturdays from 9 AM - 7 PM, in accordance with the noise bylaw, to ensure the project stays on track. Phase II is expected to start in 2023 and be completed in 2025. For more details on this project, visit **shelleycarroll.ca/east-don-ravine**.

This past January, my team and I hosted a meeting to kick off a Participatory Budgeting process in Pleasant View/Brian Village. Thank you to everyone who joined us virtually and shared your great ideas to improve the neighbourhood. We have brought these ideas to staff to see which are feasible, and are inviting the community to our Pleasant View/Brian Village PB Vote Day on Saturday, May 7 from 1 - 4 PM to choose the projects you want to see implemented in your neighbourhood.

My team has also been working diligently with staff to advance the projects chosen during last summer's PB process in Henry Farm, including lighting and playground improvements in Havenbrook Park and resurfacing the Henry Farm Tennis Club courts. We will continue to share updates as we receive more information on these projects to keep you engaged throughout the implementation process.

Park Enhancements

Many of our local parks are in the process of receiving great upgrades for the community. Bellbury Park, Pinto Park, Clydesdale Park, and Ruddington Park will all get new junior and senior play equipment. Additionally, Ruddington Park will have a new all-ages fitness circuit, while **Bellbury Park** will be home to a full-size basketball court and new gazebo with plenty of seating.

Thank you to everyone who took part in the surveys for these local park improvements. I can't wait to see these beautiful new parks once they're completed. Some will be done by year's end, while others may take a bit longer due to product delivery delays. Feel free to reach out to my office if you have questions about any of these projects.



After years of conversations with residents in the Parkway Forest community about the need for a local dog park, I'm happy to announce that the construction of a new off-leash area in Parkway Forest Park is tentatively scheduled to begin in fall of this year. The off-leash area will be located in the southwest portion of the park. I can't wait to come by and see our neighbourhood pets finally enjoying the much-needed space once it's complete.

In the Community



Keeping our community safe is a major priority for me and my team, and I know that we need to tackle this important issue from many angles. I've spent the past two years working closely with Mayor Tory and Deputy Mayor Thompson on the City's new Community Crisis Support Service Pilots, which will see new communityled solutions to mental health crises in four areas of the city. This is essential as we work to create a city that is truly safe for all.

My office has also hosted a number of community safety audits here in Don Valley North in partnership with Toronto Police to find solutions to local safety concerns. If you and your neighbours have a safety concern in your area, don't hesitate to reach out to my office. My team and I would be happy to set up a safety audit and take a proactive approach to keeping the neighbourhood safe.

Youth Council

Throughout the pandemic, I have had the invaluable experience of meeting regularly with the members of our Youth Council. They have shared so much about their experiences during this challenging time and asked insightful questions about housing, transportation, climate change, and more. It's great to finally be able to meet in-person and I look forward to learning even more from them as we start to look beyond the pandemic.

Sparroways Recreation Room

I can't wait to see the new recreation room that is in the works at the Sparroways. I worked with staff to secure funding for this much-needed upgrade, which will include a new exercise space, computer lab, and kitchen for cooking programs. This project will help create an even more vibrant community hub and provide a great space for residents to socialize. I look forward to stopping by once the project is complete!

Thank you to Officer Dale Swift



Development & Transportation

Development Updates

Don Valley North is one of the busiest and fastest-growing areas in the city. That's why my team and I put together a central webpage where you can find information on all of the development projects in our ward. I know that affordable housing is a concern for many in our community. Housing is becoming increasingly out of reach for many young people and hard to maintain for many seniors. I've been working closely with City staff on a range of initiatives to expand housing options in our neighbourhoods. The focus is to update our zoning policies to allow for more low-rise housing options like duplexes, townhouses, and low-rise apartments, particularly along some of our major roads. Thank you to everyone in the community who has taken the time to share their feedback on the proposed plan for road reconstruction on **Sheppard Avenue** from Bayview Avenue to Leslie Street. Staff are continuing to accept comments from the community as they refine the design for further consultation later this year. There are exciting changes coming to **Pleasant View Library**, including a new Digital Innovation Hub and a substantial renovation. Our community voted on these improvements back in 2014, but the process was delayed as the City waited to receive the necessary funds. During this time, I was able to negotiate extra funding for more improvements at our library and make sure that this project is included in the 2021-2030 Capital Plan.

My team and I will be hosting a community consultation on this project alongside City staff on **Wednesday**, **May 11 from 6:30 - 8:30 PM**. This will be your chance to see the exciting changes that are planned for the library and ask questions of staff. Be sure to save the date and stay in touch with my office for registration details.



I frequently hear from parents and community members who are concerned about speeding on our local roads, especially around our schools. The City's Automated Speed Enforcement (ASE) cameras are an important tool to combat this issue. The next locations for these two cameras in our ward will be **Don Mills Road south of Freshmeadow Drive** and **McNicoll Avenue near Sexton Crescent**.

My team and I have also met with many parent councils and community members to discuss road safety improvements in their neighbourhoods. If you have concerns about road safety in your area, my team and I will be happy to connect with you to find solutions.

Old Cummer GO Underpass

The Finch Hydro Corridor multi-use trail ends as it approaches **Old Cummer GO**, limiting access to this station and other major destinations like Seneca College for thousands of cyclists and pedestrians. City staff are looking into the feasibility of constructing a grade separated crossing of the rail line to better connect our cycling infrastructure here in Don Valley North. I'll be sure to keep the community updated on this project through my weekly E-Blast, so be sure to stay tuned.
